

## Cynel-Unipress Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Cynel-Unipress supports ending violence and human rights in the mining of certain minerals called “Conflict Minerals” at the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and surrounding countries. That is why we are supporting the objectives of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act. The Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI) have requested the companies which are using those “Conflict Minerals” in their production to undertake reasonable due diligence with their supply chain that specified metals are not being sourced from mines in the “Conflict Region” which are controlled by non-government unlawful military groups and frictions.

Cynel-Unipress supports the EICC and GeSI in that initiative to obtain the information from our suppliers concerning the origin of the metal used in our production which in our case is tin.

Our suppliers of tin, used in our manufacture, must demonstrate that they understand the conflict minerals regulations and will not knowingly procure tin that originate from “Conflict Region”.

Suppliers must provide written evidence of due diligence documenting that raw materials used to produce tin supplied to Cynel-Unipress do not originate from mining or smelting operations in the “Conflict Region”. Where applicable each supplier completes the reporting template widely provided by EICC-GeSI.
